The House Budget Committee passed a budget resolution that could slash Medicaid funding over the next ten years if reconciled in Congress. Spending cuts proposed by Congress aim to fund other initiatives, such as tax reductions. However, they could limit access to essential healthcare services for many Americans. He advocates frequently for I/DD in Lansing with state legislators. He has been enrolled in self-direction services with PAS for over 20 years and sat down with PAS to share his journey in self-direction.
